

We then ran up to **Heron Island** and found 16 nests with 12 of those successfully hatched.

However, judging by the current 84 now, mostly adult geese, who were fertilizing my lawn this morning I would say it is possible.

BJ Brown Memorial Shoot





Friday night featured the "Fowl Film Festival" and on Saturday evening a BBQ dinner and performance by country music singer Kristy Lee Cook.



Ridgefield NWR Topic at June Meeting

Eric Anderson with the US Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS) and former Ridgefield Refuge manager Bob Flores (recently retired in May) spoke at our June meeting. Eric covered changes coming to the Refuge in the near future.

Blind #7 will not receive water for the season start up this fall as a way to reduce heavy vegetation in that pond. The same is being considered for blind #14. There is not much enthusiasm for this type of wetland management as it would reduce the already meager number of blinds to hunt for the opener.

There was also discussion about the relocation of blind #4 in response to a complaint of pellets falling on the new trail at the **Port of Ridgefield**. **Eric** said they are awaiting permits to do any work on it, and if they are delayed may have to wait until next year.

The Refuge is also looking at out sourcing the hunt lottery beginning with 2015 season. They are considering programs similar to the **Umatilla National Wildlife Refuge (NWR)** lottery system.






