



This year there is a special raffle for Browning Gold Sporting Clays Semi-Automatic 12 gauge.




Hero of Skagit Farmed Island, Jay Koetje Loses Battle to Cancer

Jay Koetje, long-time resident of **Fir Island**, quietly passed away at home on July 29, 2014 after a hard fought, 6-year battle with cancer. He was 60 years old.

The Washington Department of Fish & Wildlife (WDFW) named Jay as one of three (3) "Volunteers of the Year" for his financial support of the Skagit Wildlife Area Farmed Island Unit. In his acceptance speech Jay simply said "I decided I would try to help the ducks out a little bit."

A little bit would be a gross understatement. In 2012 after the only available access to the island - a **WDFW** owned barge - was condemned for safety reasons, **Jay** stepped up with \$80,000 and purchased another barge and made it available at will to the **Department** for use in maintaining the **Island Unit** for waterfowl. Additionally, he provided use of a boat to push the barge, seed for planting barley and corn for waterfowl, all-terrain vehicles, tractors and fuel to maintain the dikes and for farming of the Island.

Jay used his own excavating equipment and operators to clean literally miles of drainage ditches on the Island at little to no charge to **WDFW**, and continued to provide financial and volunteer support for operational improvements and plantings as recently as this summer.

Jay's efforts to improve the Farmed Island Unit of the
Skagit Wildlife Area and to maintain it as one of the
premier public waterfowl hunting locations on the West

Jay was an avid sport fisherman, duck hunter and decoy collector. His extensive decoy collection is considered one of the most prolific in the country. They say as good as the hunting was, the story telling that followed was phenomenal. Those who had the good fortune to hunt with him there, know the waterfowl hunting there was/is exceptional.

WWA News Briefs.... WDFW Director to Retire at Year's End

OLYMPIA – After nearly six (6) years at the helm, Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) Director Phil Anderson has informed the WDFW Commission he will resign from his position, effective December 31st. The Commission, will begin the recruitment process for a new director in the next few weeks.

As director, **Anderson** guided the Department through the worst economic downturn since the **Great Depression.** During the unprecedented budget shortfall, State General Fund support for **WDFW** declined by nearly \$50 million – 45 percent – threatening Department operations and fishing and hunting opportunities throughout the state.

Also under **Anderson's** leadership, the Department developed a plan to guide state conservation and management of gray wolves as they recolonize in Washington – a controversial issue that has evoked strong reactions from people on both sides of the Cascade Range.

Throughout his career at **WDFW**, **Anderson** has played a leading role in working with Indian tribes in a number of forums, including the annual salmon

co-management process known as **North of Falcon.** During this process, the state and tribes set seasons for marine and freshwater salmon fisheries throughout **Puget Sound,** the **Columbia River** and Washington's coastal areas.

Anderson, 64, joined WDFW in 1994 after serving seven years on the Pacific Fishery Management Council (PFMC) as a private citizen, including as the council's chair. Anderson was appointed WDFW Director in 2009 after serving nearly nine (9) months as the agency's interim director. He previously served as WDFW's Deputy Director for resource policy and as Assistant Director of the Department's Intergovernmental Resource Management Program.

WWA Member Rosann Green Gets Honor

WDFW has recognized **WWA member**, **Rosann Green** of Ephrata and the **Moses Lake Chapter of WWA** as a Volunteer of the Year for 2014 for her work over several recent years in helping to recolonize pygmy rabbits, build duck blinds, band geese, collect crappie for research and process deer meat for food banks.

"Rosann has offered her assistance for every volunteer effort I have ever initiated," said Rich Finger, a WDFW biologist. "She is truly committed to assisting in WDFW's mission and deserves recognition for her efforts."




