

Our January meeting guest speaker was **Dave Jones**, **Fish and Wildlife Police Officer** - **Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW)**. Officer Jones reviewed the current plan including which areas would be open to hunting, the areas closed to hunting, and the Department's rationale for holding the extended hunting season as a depredation hunt to reduce private land damage. Much of the discussion centered on clarification of the closed Skagit Wildlife Area units and their boundaries and the closure of areas east of I-5 in Snohomish county. An excellent and lively discussion by the attending members.




TREASURER'S REPORT




