

Hello Fellow Waterfowlers —

The other day I was discussing with my wife the **Washington Waterfowl Association (WWA).** She asked me what do the members get for the membership.
Well how about:

(1) Representation concerning the future of waterfowl hunting. We are in the background fighting against injustices to the hunting community and our public lands. We are looking for help in many different arenas. Right now we have a lobbying group Natural Resource Results (NRR) in the District of Corruption (Washington DC) taking on a fight for you <u>pro bono</u>. They are also asking Delta Waterfowl and Ducks Unlimited to join the fight. Delta and DU are their paying clients. WWA Board member, Al O'Connor has been the point of the spear on this endeavor. He has been tireless — writing letters, sending emails, etc., to all who are fighting against the loss of waterfowl habitat in the Steigerwald Lake National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) and the Shillapoo Wildlife Area.

- (2) Administers the Washington State Duck Stamp Program. The WWA volunteer committee comes up with the idea for the stamp; contacts artists to draw the stamp; judges the artwork to determine that year's best artist; gets the artwork to the printers; and the finished stamp[s] and prints to the purchasing public. All sales proceeds by law go into a dedicated fund for waterfowl habitat conservation.
 - (3) Sponsors the Sanctioned WA State Duck (and Goose) Calling Contests.
- **(4)** Annually pays the full scholarships for multiple youth (boys and girls) to attend the **Youth Conservation Camp** on Orcas Island every summer.
 - (5) Represent WWA at various Sportsmens Shows around the state.
 - (6) Donate and represent WWA at the Brant Foundation Decoy Carving Contest.
 - (7) Sponsor and conduct Youth and Veteran mentored Shooting Events and
 - (8) Waterfowl Hunts around the state.
- **(9)** Hands-On Conservation Build, install and maintain Wood Duck Nesting Boxes and Mallard Nest Tubes as well as (9) refurbish, build and annually clean up hunting blinds, parking areas, trails and dikes on public hunting sites.
- (10) Participation in WDFW Policy Determination Many of our members are on the Waterfowl Advisory Group (WAG).

WWA does quite a lot in the State of Washington. Keep up the good work!

Our guest speaker at our March chapter meeting was Rob Wingard—Private Lands Manager and Biologist for Region 4, Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW).



Rob provided the attendees with information on the Private Lands Hunting Program. The process includes lands designated as "Feel Free to Hunt", "Register to Hunt" and "Hunt by Written Permission." This is a statewide program that provides the public with opportunities to hunt at private properties.

Land owners in partnership with **WDFW** allow public access for hunting on their properties. **Rob** shared information on all sites within **Snohomish**, **Skagit** and **Whatcom** counties, including data on how well the properties hunted and usage by hunters .

Rob also gave us a forward look at some of the planned enhancements to the program and how the program is currently financed through the **Farm Bill** and **Duck Stamp** funds. This program currently provides a significant amount of forage crops for waterfowl in our state.

Rob fielded many questions from the audience. Excellent presentation material. Thank you Rob for attending the chapter's meeting and sharing this valuable information with us.

The **NW Chapter** will be engaged in our annual cleanup effort at various **Skagit Wildlife Area** units. Some of these sites currently hold a significant amount of water. Wildlife Area employees are monitoring the water levels. Once the areas drain off, we will schedule the cleanup activities.

Reports need to be postmarked by the reporting deadlines even if you did not harvest any birds.



WDFW Duck Nest-Tube Project

Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) Ephrata District is continuing the second year of a 5-year pilot project tracking nesting success in duck nest tubes in Eastern Washington. Bruce Feagan from the Moses Lake Chapter of WWA, and two additional volunteers helped restore or create new tubes for this year's deployment.

Many thanks also to **Dick Price also** of **WWA-Moses Lake**, who donated chapter funds to help purchase some supplies for these tubes!

WDFW biologist Rowan has installed three (3) new tubes in one Game Reserve thus far, and will be installing or switching-out old tubes at other sites in the coming month. Special surveys will be done to evaluate nesting attempts and success this summer, aimed at reducing disturbance to the hens and ducklings.



WWA & WDFW News Briefs

WA Legislative Report

[Editor's Note: WWA is a voting member of the Washingtonians for Wildlife Conservation (WWC). WWC is a member organization of the Hunter's Heritage Council (HHC), a Washington State based organization dedicated to political action on behalf of the hunting and related communities of Washington].

Today is March 12, 2020 and the 2020 legislative session having *sine die*, or in other words it has ended. For us in the hunting community, it has been a fantastic session. I will cover four (4) aspects of the session, the first being **WDFW** related, the second being hunting related, the third being firearms related, and finally other bills of interest.

WDFW fared well in its agency request legislation. The **Department** got a \$27 million general fund lift in the supplemental budget, which was a million dollars more than they requested, and they got ongoing funds, faring far better than the Governor's budget or the state senate's budget! I feel this was necessary, as the new director needs support. I think **Director Kelly Susewind** is doing a fantastic job, and he took over an agency in crisis. He needed a win, and he got a big one in this budget battle!

On the hunting side, all the anti-hunt bills were easily killed. All the 2019 bills from last session didn't move at all, so the awful senate fee bill didn't move at all. The same with Representative Sherry Appleton's horrible dog bill, wolf bill, and wild horses bill. Senator Christine Rolfes' fee increase bill at the request of Governor Jay Inslee didn't move at all, and WDFW didn't want it to move. Unfortunately, the one good bill from last session, Senator Shelly Short's whitetail count bill, didn't move either.

WDFW had a great House Bill, HB 2571, an enforcement reform bill that passed, it allowed **WDFW** enforcement officers to issue civil penalties instead of criminal penalties on certain minor infractions if the violator has a clean background. This way the offender doesn't lose their fishing or hunting rights. A very good bill.

The **Hunters Heritage Council** has an agreement — we lead on hunting issues, and the **NRA/Second Amendment** groups lead on gun issues. This agreement works very well, so we never work against each other.

On gun issues we were remarkably successful considering how bad it could have been and considering that both **Governor Inslee** and **Attorney General Bob Ferguson** had so much agency request legislation. The gun lobby was able to kill the proposed training requirement before getting a Conceal Pistol License (CPL), large capacity magazine ban, and a so-called "assault weapons" ban.

The worst of the bills that passed will be a bureaucratic nightmare — Senate Bill SB 6288, which creates an **Office of Firearm Violence Prevention** within the executive branch of the state government. This office will be nothing more than a taxpayer-funded lobby group whose sole purpose is to erode self-defense rights in Washington.

HB 2622 is another bad bill that modifies Washington's existing firearm surrender provisions for individuals subject to a court order. This bill compels a respondent to appear and provide proof of compliance with the surrender order, a serious encroachment on the right against compelled self-incrimination. Finally, SB 5434 prohibits the possession of firearms in childcare centers. These are the three (3) anti-gun bills that passed, but if you look at the number introduced, this is a pretty small list.

On the other list is an animal cruelty bill I talked about last month. The animal-rights people tried running the senate version of the bill, SB 6300. We did the same thing to them in the senate version of the bill that we did in the house version of the bill. Most importantly, the "animal pain equals human pain" was struck from the bill.

All the vague language on pain and suffering was struck from the bill, the same with psychological pain. The final draft of the bill was a darn good bill that punishes people who hurt animals. It has been signed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House. It will become law. This will prevent the animal-rights people from running an initiative next year. It feels so good to win for a change!


